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- Questions & Answers:

Q1. If any irrigation is found in the limits of construction what will be the process for the contract to follow regarding this?

A1. Remove and cap if it presents an obstruction to proposed features (protect/preserve if not in conflict); included in Preparing ROW item.

Q2. Is the Bid Item for Adjusting Water Meter Box To Match Finish Grade Of Sidewalk included in Item 479-6003 Adjusting Manholes and Inlets?

A2. Yes, Item 479-6003 should be priced to include adjusting communications manholes and water valve/meter boxes as identified in the plans.

Water valve/meter boxes should be adjusted according to NBU standards.

Q3. Would the Adjusting Water Meter only include a vertical adjustment of the water meter box? No horizontal adjustment of actual adjustment of the meter or water piping?

A3. Adjustments may include horizontal adjustment if feasible to not conflict with walking surface of sidewalk and if sidewalk alignment cannot be adjusted around the meter box.

Q4. Will the days that are shown to not be able to have lane closures (like the Comal County Fair) have time extensions granted or will those days not be counted as a Working Day?

A4. Contractor will be expected to arrange their construction schedule to avoid lane closures on specified dates. No additional time extensions will be granted.

Q5. Can materials be stored in the Limits of Construction with fencing provided for protection? This would exclude areas in the 100 Year Flood Plain.

A5. Materials may be stored within the work site boundaries (outside of the 100-year floodplain) as long as pedestrian and vehicle access is maintained in accordance with the TCP. All material and equipment shall be protected by visible fencing, barricades, etc., or any combination thereof per TMUTCD, this protection shall also include the compliant nighttime reflectivity.

Except as provided herein, all terms and conditions of the document referenced above remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

D. Notice of Award – The Owner will award, reject, or defer the Contract within 120 days after the opening of the bid. This bid requires City Council approval for award. It is the City's intent to request approval from City Council in June 2024.

E. General Information

1. THE PROJECT: The Project is generally described as follows:

Common Street Sidewalk Pedestrian Improvements Project.
Estimated cost of this project is \$1,583,000.

2. WORK: Contractor shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Plans, Specifications and Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

Construction of six-foot sidewalks on both sides of Common St from Liberty Ave to Loop 337 and installation of enhanced pedestrian crossings at key intersections. The work includes, but is not limited to, the following estimated quantities:

- 6,065 SY sidewalk
- 52 curb ramps
- 1,833 SY driveway reconstructions
- 593 LF of curb and curb/gutter
- 3,042 LF of 12" and 24" pavement markings
- 2 Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons (PHB)
- 25 utility adjustments (manholes, water meters/valves)
- Concrete flume crossing and reconstruction

The improvements are located along existing commercial and residential streets with sporadic existing sidewalks. The primary objective of this project is to provide continuous pedestrian access from Loop 337 to Prince Solms Park on Liberty Ave.

The proposed improvements will connect with adjacent City bond program projects to be constructed by others concurrently or subsequent to this work.

3. CONTRACT TIMES:

Days to Achieve Substantial Completion and Final Payment:

The work will be substantially completed within 120 working days after the date when the Contract Times commence to run as provided in Item 3L.8 and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Item 5L.12 within 150 working days after the date when the

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Contract Times commence to run. Working days are defined in Item 8L.3.1.4 Five-Day Workweek.

4. **Liquidated Damages:** \$1,200 for every **Working Day** the Work or any portion thereof, remains incomplete after the **Final Completion** date as established by the time specified in "Contract Times." Liquidated damages are required as a means of recovering, at a minimum, construction engineering costs, Project Manager and other City related resources from a contractor.
5. **DBE Requirements – 6%**
Per Special Provisions SP000 3941-2.3.3 Apparent Low Bidder. The apparent low bidder must submit DBE commitments to satisfy the DBE goal for this project of 6% or submit good faith effort Form 2603 and supporting documentation demonstrating why the goal could not be achieved, in whole or part, no later than 5 calendar days after bid opening.
6. **Retainage – 5%**
The owner will retain five percent (5%) retainage of each application for Payment from the Contractor. Upon Final Completion of the work, the retainage shall be released.
7. **Bonding –**
Bid Bond – 5%
Performance - 100% - on Awarded Contract
Payment – 100% - on Awarded Contract
8. **Prevailing wage rates – DOL General Decision TX20240007 (Exhibit 5)**
9. **Anti-Lobbying – as indicated in the Supplemental Conditions.**
 - Lobbying activities or representations by the Bidder are prohibited between the date that the Invitation for Bid (IFB) is issued and the date of contract execution. During a no-contact period, a bidder shall make a representation only through the authorized contact person.
 - During the no-contact period, a bidder may not make a representation to a City official or to a City employee other than to the authorized contact person. This prohibition also applies to a vendor that makes a representation and then becomes a bidder.
10. **Evaluation and Selection Factors –** The Contract is to be awarded on the basis of **Lowest Responsible and Responsive Bidder.** In identifying these criteria the City will consider: 1) lowest total bid price for all work listed and specifically requested, including but not limited to: Base Bid, Extra Work items and selected Alternates. The City reserves the right to award a contract to the low Bidder as determined by "Tabulating Bids." The City will award a Contract to the second lowest Bidder when the following requirements have been met: 1) The low Bidder withdraws its bid. 2) The low Bidder fails to enter into a contract with the Owner



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after Award. 3) The Low Bidder's unit bid prices are unreasonable 4) The Low Bidder is disqualified. 5) The Low Bidder is non-responsive.

- Pay attention to Bid Errors – notes in Section 2L.11, Award and rejection information in Section 3L 1.1, Qualifications noted in 2L, Exhibit 4, and 7L 17.2-Work Requirements.

11. Equal Opportunity - All responsible bidders will receive consideration for award of contract without regard to race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.

12. NONDISCRIMINATION - The City, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000d to 2000d-4 and Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally Assisted programs of the Department of Transportation issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively insure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

5. Technical

The project was designed based on a standard topographic roadway survey. Property information shown in the plans was obtained from deed, plat and GIS data and are for reference only. Existing and proposed coordinates and elevations are surface values based on site and temporary benchmarks and are intended to be used to guide the placement of proposed features relative to one another. Actual coordinates and elevations may vary based on site conditions.

Any restoration of existing pavement edges will be incidental to bid times and will require saw-cutting the existing pavement in a straight alignment relative to the new curb line. Where reestablishment of paving is anticipated, the contractor shall notify the engineer in writing prior to performing work to establish dimensions and limits of paving.

An existing concrete flume for stormwater drainage along the County Fairgrounds frontage is proposed to be replaced by a new riprap channel with grate & frame pedestrian crossing. Construction will require saw-cutting and removing existing concrete and tying in grate & frame footings and new riprap with existing concrete as shown in the plans. Replacement of existing culverts is not required. A temporary lane closure in accordance with the standard TCP is anticipated for this work.

The Contractor will be responsible for adjusting existing communications manholes and NBU water valves and meters where indicated in the plans. The work will be performed per NBU specifications and inspected by NBU personnel for acceptance.

All Right of Entry agreements for driveway penetrations have been procured.
